The shawl afghan is made with a simple granny stitch pattern, and it's worked in the round from the center out. The finished size is approximately 30 inches by 30 inches, but you can adjust the size by adding or removing rows and stitches as needed.

Materials

- Yarn: Worsted weight yarn in two colors (approximately 500 yards of each color)
- Crochet hook: Size H (5.00 mm)

- Yarn needle

Abbreviations

- ch: chain
- sc: single crochet
- dc: double crochet
- tr: treble crochet
- sl st: slip stitch
- rep: repeat
- rnd: round

Pattern



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Rnd 1: Ch 4, join to form a ring. Ch 3 (counts as first dc),dc 10 into ring, sl st to join. (11 dc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, 2 dc in each dc around, sl st to join. (22 dc)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, *dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc; rep from * around, sl st to join. (33 dc)

Rnd 4: Ch 3, *dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc; rep from * around, sl st to join. (44 dc)

Rnd 5: Ch 3, *dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc; rep from * around, sl st to join. (55 dc)

Rnd 6: Ch 3, *dc in next 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc; rep from * around, sl st to join. (66 dc)

Rnd 7: Ch 3, *dc in next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc; rep from * around, sl st to join. (77 dc)

Rnd 8: Ch 3, *dc in next 6 dc, 2 dc in next dc; rep from * around, sl st to join. (88 dc)

Continue increasing in this manner until the shawl afghan reaches the desired size. Fasten off and weave in loose ends.

Finishing

The shawl afghan can be finished with a simple border of your choice. Some popular border options include:

- Single crochet border: Work a row of single crochet stitches around the edge of the shawl afghan.
- Double crochet border: Work a row of double crochet stitches around the edge of the shawl afghan.

- Treble crochet border: Work a row of treble crochet stitches around the edge of the shawl afghan.

Once the border is complete, fasten off and weave in loose ends.

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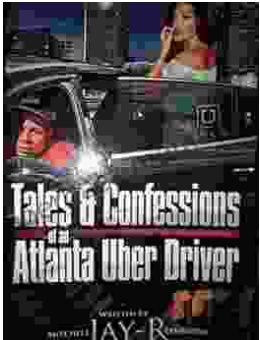
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
