


They learned that it is important to be brave, to be resourceful, and to never give up.

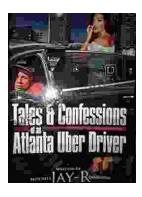
